This is the story of a boy born to a teenaged single mother in a single-wide trailer, with no assets beyond his dead father's good looks and copper-coloured hair, a caustic wit, and a fierce talent for survival. In a plot that never pauses for breath, relayed in his own unsparing voice, he braves the modern perils of foster care, child labour, derelict schools, athletic success, addiction, disastrous loves, and crushing losses.

Those who knew the story of David Copperfield by Charles Dickens, which were based on his own experience as a survivor of institutional poverty and its damages to children in society, felt these were still to be solved in ours! We felt that the author was trying to be helpful in encouraging people to

improve themselves but it showed that nothing changes over time no matter what good intentions there were out there then and still we hope to change things for the underprivileged now. A lively discussion! **Joyce**

St Faith's church is built of mellow Northampton stone and dates from the 12thC with the north aisle added shortly after. Kilsby was a strongly puritan village. Following the Reformation, the church's medieval decoration, including wall paintings, rood screen and stained glass, were destroyed. The present stained glass is mostly Victorian and the pews are Georgian. The church building has withstood many potential disasters, including a fire in the tower in 1911 and, due to subsidence many years ago, the north aisle leans quite alarmingly but is quite safe.

We moved from the church and walked back through the village passing Cedar Lodge where Robert Stephenson, inventor of the locomotive the "Rocket" lived. Stephenson planned and was in charge of the construction of the one-and-a-half-mile long Kilsby tunnel.

While we were in the church Alan gave us lots of interesting facts relating to the building of the tunnel. Then it was onto The Red Lion for a lovely lunch. For our January stroll we will be going to Leire. **Linda Griffin**

Topical Discussion Group - Co-ordinator: Richard Whittington

1. Israel and Gaza.

We were all very saddened by this ongoing war. To some extent it is a war between two religions, Shia Muslims and Jews. It could be said that Hamas has the same end goal as the Nazis, ie. the elimination of Jews. It is understandable that Israel wants to defend itself against such ideology but eliminating an idea is very difficult.

The actions of Israel against Hamas are destroying Gaza, along with very many innocents and is probably creating more Hamas members for the future.

During this conflict it appears that the UN is very weak.

We get a lot of useful intelligence from Israeli intelligence that we wish to continue using. The conflict in Northern Ireland was only solved after both sides agreed to stop the violence and begin to learn to live together.

Israel and the Palestinians need to do the same and give Hamas no reason to fight.

The two-state solution is possibly the best option although not without problems.

2. Should the Wycliffe and Lutterworth U3A groups join together.

Art Appreciation – Co-ordinators Rae Flowerday and Sue Woodhead

The Black Death swept through Europe and parts of Asia that killed three-quarters of the population in 20 years. When the plague exploded, it resulted in radical changes to the course of society and Art. In the cloistered burial ground called Campo Santo in Pisa, a fresco attributed to Francesco Traini "" Triumph of Death" summed up the prevailing pessimism from the plague.

Such pessimism could no last, and toward the end of that Century, a new spirit arose throughout Europe called "International Gothic" style. An anonymous work, the "Wilton Diptych" (1395-1399) was a magnificent, but small diptych and commissioned for the private devotions of Richard 2nd of England. It has an image of Richard, which is probably a real portrait. It shows Richard's patron saint, St John the Baptist, touching the Kings shoulder. This style moves on from the previous century, by having the simplicity of a symmetrical design.

Music Appreciation Group - Co-ordinators John Peverley and Tony MacDonald

In November we were made very welcome as always at the home of Alan and Lynda Shean where Alan's topic was Classical Music One Hit Wonders of the 17th, 18th and 19th centuries. As always Alan's research was meticulous as he related the life stories of the chosen composers who, despite their initial success, were not able to join the "big boys", Beethoven, Mozart etc popular at the time.

We listened to music from seven composers: Luigi Boccherini, Pietro Mascagni, Franz Lehar, Albert Ketelbey, Jeremiah Clark, Charles-Marie Widor and Amilcare Ponchielli and then voted for our top three of these.

They were: in third place, Mascari's Intermezzo from Cavalleria Rusticana, in second place, Widor's Symphony No 5 in F minor Op 42 No 1 and in first place was Ponchielli's La Gioconda Ballet Interlude Dance of the Hours which, if you were to hear it, you would recognise from Allan Sherman's 1963 book and comedy song "Hello Muddah, Hello Fadduh here I am at Camp Granada". **Linda**

Music and Memories 2 - Co-ordinator Eve Jackson


It was good to be together again in November, after missing three meetings due to illness and holidays. Thank you to everyone who continue to support the group.
