Start Point and Time: The Bell Inn, Main Street, Gumley, LE16 7RU. Leave at

10.00am. Toilets will be available.



Directions to start : Avoid narrow country lanes by going to Lubenham and taking

the 3rd turn left signposted Foxton. Continue towards Foxton for 1.5 miles and at the T junction turn left and then **immediately** left again for another 1.5 miles to Gumley. Watch out for the S bend after the humped canal bridge! There is limited parking at the Bell Inn (see picture) but Main Street is wide (beware of sharp granite

kerbstones). It is 13.25 miles each way.

Route and distance: A 4.75 mile figure of 8 route between Gumley and Laughton. Domesday villages (last walked in October 2019) with 5 "normal" foliage-free stiles on route. Regular walkers will gather by now that Gumley is a firm favourite of ours, with great views of sheep meadows, thickets and hills. Walk duration is 2 1/4 hours plus a 15 minute break, and lunch afterwards at The Bell is booked for 12.30pm.

The walk begins by turning left off Main Street and descending through horse meadows to our first stile at a small brook. Crossing over and swinging right along a bridle way we emerge at Gumley Lodge and walk along the drive's grassy verge to bear right at a fence and through a gate. Climbing uphill though pleasant sheep meadows we emerge on a minor road to enter Laughton's eclectic village.



Taking our half-way break at the 13th century church of St Luke gives us a chance to admire the fine wattle and daub walls on its boundaries and also to study the building itself. This was originally of cobble walling and ironstone but was tastefully extended in 1879-80 by the Victorians to compensate for the earlier removal of the church's cross-shaped naves back in 1780.

Our return leg to Gumley then retraces our entry road before swinging left on to a bridle way which drops down to Gumley Lodge again through a series of kissing gates. This gives us opportunities to see the distant views that couldn't be easily seen on our outward leg, without having to turn around. From the Lodge it's then just a short distance, and unfortunately a final steep climb, to Gumley village and the Bell Inn.

Once there, those of us who have been before will enjoy renewing their acquaintance with this cozy beamed Inn and its proprietor Michelle. Not forgetting of course Carol in the kitchen and friendly serving staff and regulars.

The mid-day lunch Is good and reasonably priced, Mains being £7.75 and Starters £3. Most importantly, they also serve crumble the proper way with custard in a jug. For gourmets, the still good value main menu offers more variety for £5 or £6 more. Enjoy. **Tony and Paul**

Early Renaissance Sculpture in Florence

The lecturer explored his reasons that Sculpture rather than paintings, led to the development of the *Renaissance style*. He singled out several great sculptors of the early 15c. including Brunelleschi, Ghiberti and Donatello. ... Brunelleschi and Ghiberti were the finalist in a competition to design a second set of bronze doors for the baptistery of the Cathedral of Florence. Ghiberti was awarded the commission. His famous "*Sacrifice of Isaac*", a relief work of 28 bronze panels, took 20 years to complete(1401). Donatello's most famous work is probably his bronze, life-size "*DAVID*" (1430's) The Medici owned the sculpture, but it is not known if they commissioned it.

After coffee we looked at and discussed the differing landscape paintings from 3 different artists. They were, JW Turners "Fighting Temeraire" (1839), John Constables "Wivenhoe Park" (1816), Eugene Delacroix "Liberty" - Leading the people. (1830). These three artists would have been aware of each other's work and admired them.
